AP Exam Testing Information

This document provides information and reminders to prepare for taking your AP exam(s). Please read each part carefully to ensure you have all the essential information.

Please note that all Pennsylvania School Districts will also conduct Keystone Exams during the AP testing window. To ensure AP Exams are completed successfully, please adhere to the details outlined below.

All Exams are Digital or Digital Hybrid: You must bring your school-issued iPad fully charged to every exam.

Locations:

All exams are held at Hempfield High School (HHS).

- You will check in at the hallway connecting LG1 and LG2.
- If you are taking an 8:00 am exam, please arrive by 7:30 am at the exam location.
- If you are taking a 12:00 pm exam, please arrive by 11:30 am at the exam location.
- Plan transportation accordingly, since buses may not arrive at HHS by 7:30 am, and the afternoon exams may be finished after 3:00 pm, after dismissal. You will need to plan for your own transportation on the day of your exam(s).
- All Drop-offs are at Hempfield High School (HHS).
- Parking is only allowed at student lots. There is NO parking in faculty parking areas.
- If you are taking two exams on the same day, you are responsible for providing your lunch. There should be enough time for you to eat between the morning exam and the afternoon exam.
- You are responsible for notifying your teachers that you will be missing their classes during your exam time. Please inform your teachers in advance that you will be missing their class due to exam testing.
- If you are taking a morning exam, you are expected to attend your classes after you complete the morning exam. You can go to the cafeteria to eat lunch after you finish your exam and head to the remainder of your classes.
- If you are taking an afternoon exam, you are expected to attend your period 1 and period 2 classes before your afternoon exam. You can go to the cafeteria to eat your lunch before your exam.
- If you are taking a foreign language exam or music theory, make sure to have your school-issued iPad, fully charged, with cable and charger as well as an updated DAC download from the self-service app.

 If you absolutely cannot take your exam on the standard test date, please contact Mr. Snitzer (mark_snitzer@hempfieldsd.org) immediately to be considered for late testing. There have to be significant extenuating circumstances to be considered for late testing. These circumstances are explicitly identified by College Board. There may be a late test fee assessed, depending on the reason for late testing.

What Students Should Bring to the Exam Room (From College Board)

For All Exams:

- A Watch
- A government-issued or school-issued photo ID if you don't attend the school where you're taking the exam.

For Fully Digital AP Exams:

- Fully charged iPad and a charging cord (in case you need to refresh your charge)
- College Board account login information to log in to Bluebook.
- Pencils or pens for taking notes on school-provided scratch paper.
- External keyboard: This should be provided for all students in 10th, 11th, and 12th grade. 9th-grade students will be receiving keyboards from the school
- For AP Environmental Science Exams: up to 2 approved calculators.

For Hybrid Digital AP Exams:

- All items listed under Fully digital AP Exams apply, plus
- 2 No. 2 Pencils with erasers or 2 pens with black or dark blue ink
- Up to 2 approved calculators. For the exam you are taking
 - Graphing Calculator Biology, Calc AB & BC, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics CM, Physics CE&M, Precalc, Statistics
 - Four-Function Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science,
 Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Physics CM and Physics CE&M
 - Scientific Calculator Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics CM and Physics CE&M
- For an AP Physics Exam a ruler or straightedge.

What Students Should NOT Bring to the Exam Room* (From College Board):

*Unless approved as an accommodation by College Board's SSD office before the exam date.

- Electronic equipment of any kind, except devices being used for digital AP Exams
- All stylus pens, Apple pens, smart pens, iPad pencils, and other electronic writing instruments
- Books, compasses, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or notes.
- Mechanical pencils, No. 3 pencils, or colored pencils.
- Rulers or straightedges (these are allowed only for AP Physics Exams).
- Protractors.
- Scratch paper (scratch paper provided by the proctor).
- Computers or calculators (except as previously noted).
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Watches that beep or have an alarm.
- Food or drink.
- Clothing or shoes with subject-related information.
- New: Head coverings (hats, brimmed caps, etc.) are not permitted while testing.
 Head coverings worn for medical or religious reasons are permitted during
 testing, provided they do not obstruct the testing staff's ability to view the test
 taker's eyes and ears.
- Ear plugs
- Clipboards
- Privacy screens.
- Separate computer monitors.

A student observed with any of these prohibited items during testing or breaks may be dismissed from the exam, the device may be confiscated, the student's score may be canceled, and no retest may be permitted.

It is strongly encouraged that you do not bring any prohibited items to the exam room. Otherwise, the prohibited item(s) will be secured by the proctor during the exam. The item(s) will be returned to the student at the end of the exam.
